QUORUM:

Ms. McCord called the meeting to order at 5:06 p.m. and determined there was a quorum with at least one member of the minority party being present.

WELCOME GUESTS:

Amy Sullivan, Stephen Feryus, and Richard Siejack from the staff were present for the meeting. Dawn Villani, Lowell Sheets, Kathy McGill, Michele Mannion, Daniel Brulenski, Cristine Trotto-Pecovic, Scott DeLong, Michelle Murray, David Tritt, and David Kane were present from the public.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Price motioned to approve the April 28, 2022, regular meeting minutes and Mr. Dykes seconded. The minutes were approved by all members who were present for that meeting.

ADDITIONS OR CHANGES TO THE AGENDA:

Additions to the agenda included voting on the July Board Meeting date and voting for the President and Secretary for 2022 Board of Canvassers.

ELECTION OFFICE REPORT:

Ms. Taylor gave the Administration update. Discussion was as follows:

Ms. Taylor explained the MAEO Conference would be virtual or in person at Anne Arundel County Board of Elections on September 22, 2022. The office plans to attend virtually and Ms. Taylor asked the Board to let her know if they plan to attend virtually or in person.

Ms. Taylor gave the Staff update. Discussion was as follows:

Ms. Taylor stated that Ms. Bednarek would be starting June 1st. She also stated the EDSS posting through the County would be open for another week.

Ms. Taylor gave the Election Operations update. Discussion was as follows:

Ms. Taylor added there is a binder in the lobby with samples of the ballots.

Ms. Slusar gave the Election Judge update.

Ms. Taylor gave the Redistricting update. Discussion was as follows:

Mr. Richardson asked if other counties were complete with their redistricting. Ms. Taylor explained Montgomery County was still working on redistricting.

Ms. Sullivan and Mr. Feryus gave the Voter Registration update. Discussion was as follows:

Ms. McCord requested Ms. Sullivan explain the processes of each category she was reporting so members of the public could be more informed.

Mr. Richardson questioned if the Voter Registration Applications were new voters. Ms. Sullivan said they could be new voters or updates from voters.

Ms. McCord addressed the visitors giving them 3 minutes to ask questions regarding the Voter Registration Statistics given by Ms. Sullivan.

Discussion from the visitors was as follows:

Can we submit items for the next agenda? This information packet was given to Mr. Young.

How far in advance do questions need to be presented before a Board Meeting? Ms. McCord said all questions need to be submitted to Ms. Taylor 48 hours prior to a Board Meeting.

The movie 2000 Mules was brought up by one of the visitors and who questioned stuffing the drop boxes. Ms. Taylor explained mail in ballot procedures and the introduction of drop boxes during the 2020 election. She also explained during the pandemic there were changes on a daily/hourly basis as directed by SBE. Ms. Taylor said the Deputy Director monitored the footage but with the current system it was not possible for the footage to be held for 22 months. She explained that since then, the office has spent \$17,000 to procure new cameras that are able to retain footage for 22 months.

Another question was asked about mail in ballots and Ms. Taylor explained the identifiers on each envelope and how they can be researched. She also explained ballots without an envelope and their procedures.

Mr. Young explained there are system checks in place to see if a ballot has been voted or if a person has already voted.

A member of the public questioned ballot harvesting, and Ms. Taylor explained that each ballot envelope has an oath that is required by law for the voter to sign.

The mail in ballot process was questioned again and Ms. Taylor explained the process.

More questions ensued but Mr. Young explained the 3-minute time limit and requested the meeting be resumed.

Mr. Feryus continued with the current Voter Registration status.

Mr. Richardson asked when the last day is to request a mail in ballot. Ms. Taylor said it is July 12th.

Mrs. Taylor gave the Legislative update.

Ms. Taylor gave the Upcoming Events timeline.

BOARD ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

There was no report at this time.

OLD BUSINESS:

Ms. McCord said they are waiting on a nominee from the Democratic Central Committee to fill the vacant Board position.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. McCord explained the July 27th Board Meeting needed to be reviewed since it occurs in the middle of the Primary election canvass. Mr. Richardson made a motion to cancel the July 27th meeting. Mr. Dykes seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved.

Ms. McCord explained that a President and Secretary needed to be appointed for the 2022 Board of Canvassers. Mr. Price made a motion that Ms. McCord serve as President and Mr. Dykes seconded. The Board unanimously approved. Mr. Price made a motion that Mr. Richardson serve as Secretary of the Board of Canvassers and Mr. Dykes seconded. The Board unanimously approved. Ms. McCord asked that the Clerk of Court be at the June 22nd Board meeting to swear

them in. Mr. Richardson explained he would not be at that meeting but would make an appointment to go to the Clerk of Court for swearing in.

CONFIRMATION OF NEXT MEETING:

The next meeting is scheduled for June 22, 2022, at 5:00 p.m.

MEMBERS TIME:

Ms. McCord read a letter she received from Catherine “Maggie” Mundle who expressed how happy she was to serve in the office but how sad she was to be leaving.

Ms. McCord then addressed the visitors thanking them for being concerned and caring deeply about elections. She explained that the Board cares as much as they do. Ms. McCord then expressed how pleased the Board is to have a director with over 10 years of dedicated experience.

One of the guests asked if Ms. McCord had heard about the research from Seth Keshel and when they might get a response from the Board regarding previously submitted questions. Ms. McCord explained that some responses had to come from SBE and they would hear from us soon.

Another guest wanted to know if the new cameras would allow citizens to view the footage 24 hours a day or would they have to have people from their group to monitor them in person. Ms. Taylor explained this information is being addressed by SBE.

Another guest asked if mail in ballots were being sent out to everyone. Ms. Taylor said no, but explained that mail in ballot applications were sent out in January.

Another guest asked when the mail in ballots need to be received to count. Ms. Taylor said that mail in ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day.

Another guest asked about the 22-month camera footage retention and another discussion ensued regarding security cameras versus security personnel usage.

Another guest said that no one was questioning the office’s integrity but that things are being done beneath our noses.

Mr. Richardson asked when the ballots would be mailed to the voters. Ms. Taylor stated that SBE mails the ballots and we have not been given the mailing date yet.

CLOSED SESSION:

There was a closed session that began at 5:58pm.

ADJOURNMENT:

Mr. Price made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Mr. Dykes seconded. The regular meeting adjourned at 5:53 p.m.

ELECTION OFFICE REPORT
June 22, 2022

Administration:

- The County administration has approved additional storage space for the warehouse. We will have access to the space beginning August 1, 2022.
- We have implemented an electronic visitor sign-in/out program.
- MAEO Conference will be held virtually or in person at Anne Arundel County on September 22, 2022. I need to know if you plan to attend in person so I can pay the conference fee.

Staff Updates:

- We hired eight Election Day Support Specialists (EDSS) that started June 21st. They will help with the Logic and Accuracy (L&A) testing of the voting equipment and support the Early Voting sites and polling places on Election Day.
- Rich Siejack accepted the Deputy Director position in Anne Arundel County. He will be missed but we wish him well.

Election Operations

- Reminder that the Early Voting scanners will be canvassed on July 19th (time TBD) and the Board is required to be present.
- Mail-in ballots (MIB) were mailed to voters who requested one on June 9th.
- The second round of MIB applications were mailed on June 9th to voters who newly registered, moved into the county, had party changes or to the unaffiliated voters that have a competitive school board race.
- Ballots for Early Voting and Election Day were delivered June 14th.
- Logic and Accuracy (L&A) testing on the voting equipment began June 9th.

Election Judges:

- We are finishing up training classes this week. We plan to add a few more training dates in the next two weeks if needed.
- We are still actively recruiting new judges and have ongoing Meet & Greets.
- We continue to re-organize the allocations and assignments of election judges as changes happen and new judges are hired.
- Election Day allocation is almost complete.
- The early voting schedule has been finalized and assignments have been sent to the Chiefs, SDR (Same Day Registration) and Provisional judges.
- We continue to work on packing for Election Day and Early Voting.
- Daily judge work continues - emailing potential new judges, importing judge data and changes, phone calls, mail, and emails.

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- Open house for the election judges is scheduled on June 23rd & 24th from 9 am-7 pm and Saturday June 25th from 9 am -12 noon
- The current party affiliation statistics are Rep – 257, Dem – 302, Other - 93

- Detention Center: The original contact person has been replaced. Cliff has been in contact with the new person, and she has a good understanding of the program. However, there still has not been an interest in voting or registering to vote from the inmates.
- Nursing Home/Assisted Living: Still have request meandering in for mail in ballots. Cliff does not think there will be a huge rush in requests; but they will continue to trickle in.
- Voter Registration Volunteer Training: We had one training session during the month. It was not as exciting as a few of the previous sessions; but it was still quite good.
