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## HARFORD COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS OFFICE REPORT October 22, 2025

### Administration:

- Our open house was well attended. The sheriff's department gave a highly informative public safety presentation.
- Karen and I re-certified for the Open Meetings Act.

### Staff Updates:

- None currently

### Election Operations

- Pollbook battery test underway - Sampling 30 random units to test battery capacity; current batch of completed tests range from 3 hours to 3.75 hours.
- Received, uploaded, and tested official election databases for Aberdeen and Bel Air; We are ready to perform Logic & Accuracy testing on the week of 10/27.
- The Departments of Aging and Parks and Rec have agreed to not schedule any activities during Early Voting at the McFaul Activity Center for the safety of their members and the voters.

### Election Judges:

- We sent our Fall Newsletter out on October 1, 2025.
- Meet and Greet sessions continue to bring in new people. We have had sixty-six attendees to date.
- We have had over 650 responses for our returning judge availability survey. We plan to send a follow-up email by the end of the month to catch the remaining judges.
- The Same Day Registration Workshop has received a positive response, and we have over 80% of the class slots reserved.
- We have submitted the final design and are moving forward on the production of the new Election Judge Pin.
- We are finishing the packing for the Aberdeen and Bel Air Municipal Elections.
- We are training people for the Aberdeen and Bel Air Municipal Elections.
