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HARFORD COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS
OFFICE REPORT
March 25, 2026

Administration:

- We had a flood in the office on February 23rd. Fortunately there was no damage to any equipment or documents.
- The staff had the opportunity to meet with advisors from Maryland State Retirement Program.

Staff Updates:

- Our two contractual pins have been posted on the State of Maryland's website.
- Election support staff (ESS) documents were sent to County HR; the job will be posted in April. ESS will start the day after Memorial Day.
- Jackie Ludwig has resigned from her position in the Judge Department.

Election Operations:

- We conducted the manual auditing phase of SBE's Risk Limiting Audit pilot. One precinct with 225 scanned ballots was selected from the Arlo audit software.
 - Office staff were trained in the usage of Arlo by a representative from Voting Works.
 - The whole office participated in sorting the ballots into batches of twenty-five to be tallied into a spreadsheet.
 - The final tallies matched the expected scanner results tape.
 - In practice, this process is nearly identical to the manual audits done in past elections.
- As per retention schedule, all 2024 Primary Election documents were shredded.
- The vendor, ES&S, hosted a public demonstration of the new voting equipment March 23-25 from 9am-5pm daily. The locations are in Baltimore, Rockville, and Grasonville.
- We met with the election equipment transportation company today.
- Continuing regular equipment charging & maintenance.
- Havre de Grace has chosen to work with ES&S for their municipal election this year. We will provide them with the precinct register.

Election Judges:

- We held three different SDR Workshop and we had over thirty people attend.
- We started sending out the training emails and started training our first group on the 24th.

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- We continue to have Meet and Greets to recruit new judges.
- We received our judge manuals from the printer.
- We finalized our training materials and continue to pack up the judge supplies.
- Break down by party of people who have applied to be an election judge:
 - Democratic - 356
 - Republican - 305
 - Unaffiliated - 153
 - Other - 8

Current as of 3/18/26

- In addition to regular daily work, we have received two fuzzy matching reports; deceased and potential duplicates. We continue to receive documents from the jury commissioner and should receive our next deceased list through the Maryland Department of Health soon. There has been increased interest in Voter Registration Volunteer (VRV) training, and we have recently held several VRV classes, in-person as well as virtual.

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Legislation

- Deadlines have passed for new bills to be introduced. March 23rd is the deadline for bills to crossover from one chamber to the other. April 13th is "Sine Die" day when bills must have passed both chambers to go to the governor for signature and enactment.
- As of writing on 3/19, ninety-three election bills have been introduced to the legislature and twenty-six have passed one chamber. There are several bills in particular which MAEO and our office have been following:
 - HB0621/SB0443 Local Boards of Elections – Board Counsel – Qualifications
 - Updates the requirements for LBE attorneys to be registered to vote in the state instead of their jurisdiction. This will be of particular benefit to our smaller, rural jurisdictions.
 - HB263/SB0100 Election Law – Early Voting Centers-Bus Stop
 - This departmental bill requires county or municipal bus routes to allow passengers to embark and disembark directly at the entrance of an early voting center if the center is located within one-half mile of the fixed route. (effective Jan. 2027)
 - HB0115/SB0241 Election Law – Individuals Released from State Correctional Facilities – Automatic Restoration of Voter Registration
 - Requires that those individuals who have been convicted of a felony and are no longer incarcerated have their voter registration automatically.

Candidate Filing

- Candidate filing is closed. We filed ninety-eight candidates, had ten withdrawals, and two were disqualified to be on the ballot.

**Re: Republican Election Judge Applicants & Compliance with MD Code, Election Law § 10-201
(Effective October 1, 2025) and Policy 2025-04**

Dear Director DeMarinis:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Maryland Republican Party regarding Republican election judge applicants and their compliance with the above-referenced election laws and policies. Our primary objective is to address the issues and proposals related to electoral parity set forth below.

We wish to emphasize the importance of ensuring fair and equitable electoral processes. There are several key areas where improvements are necessary to achieve this goal. We urge the Board to consider these recommendations seriously and to implement changes that will enhance the integrity and fairness of our elections.

A prime example is the language promulgated in Section 10-201(b)(1), effective October 1, 2025, which states:

“Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, to the extent practicable, each polling place shall have an equal number of election judges, including chief judges designated under § 10-203, from: (i) the majority party; and

(ii) the principal minority party.” Although the statute now includes the phrase “to the extent practicable,” this language does not dilute the obligation. It imposes a duty of affirmative effort and documented good-faith compliance. Parity remains the governing standard.

Where parity is not achieved, the Board must be prepared to demonstrate that it took all reasonable efforts to secure a balanced representation of the Parties. This is crucial for maintaining public confidence in the electoral system.

The limited statutory exceptions, inclusive of the provisions allowing unaffiliated or minor judges when six (6) or more judges are assigned, as well as the forty-five (45) day chief judge contingency, are narrow in scope and do not authorize routine deviation from bipartisan parity standards.

Policy 2025-04 reinforces these statutory requirements by mandating monthly vacancy reporting beginning February 2026, including polling place identification and party breakdown by judge type. This reporting requirement exists precisely to prevent parity deficiencies from persisting unchecked.

We understand the complexities involved in electoral administration and appreciate the Board's ongoing efforts to uphold democratic principles. However, we believe election judge parity is a structural safeguard designed to ensure integrity at the polling place. We trust that each Board will review its staffing assignments, document its recruiting efforts and confirm complete compliance with MD Code, Election Law § 10-201, and Policy 2025-04. We are eager to collaborate with all Boards to ensure strict adherence to the law.
